





☐ Current lack of accurate data on youth and adult literacy and numeracy

☐ **Funding** and coordination as challenges in implementing e-PASS







Language, Multilingualism and Literacy

☐ Literacy skills in the **home language** remain central to adult learning.



Linguistic policies to preserve and promote local languages are adopted by GAL countries

☐ Programmes by local implementers use national language training to enhance local capacity for community development.

Linking languages, multilingualism, and literacy involves using reading materials that resonate with the cultural and community contexts of learners and their families.

Planned activities for 2024

Continue GEC-GAL training for other countries in other languages and e-PASS contextualization.

Support to countries on specific programmes on a needs' basis.


Create an online workshop on how to prepare national literacy strategies from a lifelong learning perspective.

Publish a case study compilation on professional development of literacy educators.

Continue building new partnerships but also engaging with the current partners for more consolidated support.

Organize technical webinars and create a community of practice if there is an interest.
