

# What is the CEC (Community Education Center)?

- It is a local learning center managed at the municipal level and which serves as a place of training, information and awareness-raising for young people and adults.
- Identify areas of training / information adapted to the potential of the environment;
- Coordinate the training offers of partners under the leadership of the municipal council.







-Professional/qualifying training (Sewing, hairdressing, etc.)









Currently, 7 CECs are supported in the current partner municipalities of the program, In total since the beginning of the initiative, 20 Community Education Centers (CECs) have been supported or set up in 20 municipalities.





















# Reflect method

Together with the learners, the facilitator visualizes the causes and effects of an everyday problem, identified by the learners using drawings, locally generated materials and key words, which the participants learn to read and write

In this way, participants acquire:
Reading, writing and numeracy skills,
Key skills to improve their concrete life situation in terms of income, infrastructure, health care or social cohesion.







## Challenges

- Security issues due to constant conflicts and crises;
- Absence of an appropriate funding mechanism for the services of the Community Education Centers;
- The weak synergy of actions between non-formal stakeholders;
- Lack of a framework for sharing experience between CECs.





#### **Current situation and challenges**

Strict gender segregation in social life, including in the education system.

The education system was initially closed to girls.

At present, girls can again participate in school education up to the 6th grade.

Access for girls to the secondary levels of grades 7-12 and to other educational opportunities for (young) women will remain closed for the time being.

Different approach. In 8 out of 34 provinces, girls' classes up to the 12th grade and access to private educational institutions have been opened up. (Balkh, Samangan, Sar-e-Pul, Jawzjan, Kunduz, Herat, Ghor and Zabul)



# **Current situation and challenges**

- The strict gender segregation meets with a shortage of female and male teachers.
- Existing educational programs can no longer be carried out to their full extent.

- A high number of missed classes, blocked access to education, especially for women.



### **Current situation and challenges**

- Education deficits are increasing massively and cause a restriction of fundamental right to education, and long-term consequences for the society.
- Education deficits and empty classes lead to an educational catastrophe.
